





Context



Dr. Isam Osman was the Head of the Vascular and Endovascular Department and Operating Theatres in King Saud Medical City, KSA. He passed away on September 29, 2023, and left a legacy of surgical excellence, leadership, and mentorship. Dr. Osman had a prominent leading role in SAMA's humanitarian relief and learning programs. Shortly before his death, he led a surgical mission to Port Sudan to support the fragile health system. To preserve Dr. Osman's legacy, SAMA organized this humanitarian mission, led by Dr. Amir Elhassan, a Consultant Cardiothoracic Anesthesiologist in California, USA.

In this mission, SAMA leveraged its experience in organizing missions to Sudan. From 2014 to 2020, SAMA organized 7 <u>surgical missions</u> to Sudan from the USA that performed more than 110 surgeries in public sector hospitals.

This mission came in a time of great need, as since the war broke out in April 2023, the health system in Sudan has suffered massive losses in manpower, medications, and medical supplies.



Mission Aim



 To provide Anesthesia related medications and medical supplies to Osman Digna Hospital.

- To conduct hands-on training for anesthesia personnel on various anesthesia procedures at Osman Digna Hospital.
- Delivering direct patients care at Osman Digna Hospital.



Target

- Patients undergoing surgeries at Osman Digna Hospital
- Anesthesia personnel working at Osman Digna Hospital



What we did?

- Delivery of anesthetic drugs and equipment.
- Provided in-person training of anesthesia personnel at Osman Digna Referral Hospital operating rooms.
- Repairing a non-functional anesthesia machine at the hospital.

Mission implementation

Phase 1: Mission idea is born (October 29, 2023)

Sudan and SAMA have recently tragically lost some of the best medical minds that came out of Sudan Dr. Isam Osman and Dr. Bushra Ibnauf. We still are grieving the loss of their lives, medical knowledge, courage, and willingness to give back to Sudan. It became essential that what they have started must continue in their honor and the fruits of their labor and sacrifices should continue to benefit their countrymen. Dr. Amir Elhassan approached SAMA about his interest in organizing a mission with a focus on his area of expertise, anesthesiology.

Phase 2: Need Assessment

Connected with clinicians in Osman Digna Hospital who provided a wishlist of medical supplies and medications.

We also conducted a learning need assessment to determine the objectives of the mentorship and training program.

Phase 3: Network mobilization

We reached out to various United States entities who provided in-kind donations of anesthesia-related medications and medical supplies worth more than \$35,000

Phase 4: Execution (February 23- March 1, 2024)

February 23, 2024

Dr. Amir Elhassan arrived in Port Sudan from the United States, carrying with him the medications and medical supplies.

February 24, 25 2024

Dr. Amir Elhassan trained residents in anesthesiology and critical care at Dr. Bushra Ibnauf Center for Learning about various anesthesiology topics including training on Ultrasound-guided vascular access.

February 26-29, 2024

Dr. Amir Elhassan delivered direct care to patients undergoing surgeries at Osman Digna Hospital. He also provided training to anesthesia personnel



Medical supplies

- Essential and urgently needed anesthetic drugs including propofol, vecuronium and intravenous acetaminophen.
- Reusable and disposable medical equipment including a video laryngoscope with adult and pediatric attachments, adult and pediatric standard and specialized endotracheal tubes, intubating stylets, intravenous cannulae, reusable Magill forceps and reusable adult and pediatric direct laryngoscopes and laryngoscopy blades.

Training



- Dr. Amir Elhassan provided a teaching session for the anesthesiology residents on how to use the video laryngoscopy, and supervised the residents as they performed the procedure inside the operating room; about 20 residents received this training on day 1.
- Essential medications were delivered to Osman Digna Hospital, where Dr. Amir Elhassan trained Anesthesiology providers on how to use these medications.





Lessons Learnt

- Warm welcome in Port Sudan by the Osman Digna Hospital leadership, partner organizations, and SAMA support group on-site.
- Safety of the city: No signs of conflict, it is anticipated that Port Sudan will continue to be spared and it is currently a hub for humanitarian relief efforts of various international organizations.
- Feasibility: We received substantial cooperation at the airport from the authorities, the national medicines and poisons board and airport directorate that facilitated the entry of the medications and medical supplies.
- Identified a great need for medications, supplies, and educational activities.
- We established new connections with important stakeholders on the ground who are willing to provide help in future missions.




