#### **Learners Feedback**

**Response rate:** The feedback survey received a response rate of 20.2% of the total attendance.

#### **Key Findings (Cumulative Analysis)**

#### **Relevance of Sessions:**

of learners rated the sessions as either very relevant or extremely relevant to their work

#### **Balance Between Lecture and Interactivity:**

of participants felt there was an appropriate balance between lecture content and interactive elements.

#### **Change in Knowledge Levels:**

The evaluation of knowledge levels before and after the sessions showed a positive change for the majority of topics, particularly in the "very knowledgeable" and "extremely knowledgeable" categories.

#### **Application of Learning:**

of learners indicated they will probably or definitely apply what they learned in their work.

#### **Recommendation:**

95% of participants would recommend the sessions to a colleague, with a rating of 8, 9, or 10 in terms of strengths.






#### **Partners**




